Formula Female Race Against Cancer to raise money for Irish Cancer Society

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – July 20, 2018 – Adding to its already substantial support of Irish auto racing and race culture, the John and Suzanne Campion Family Foundation, through their motorsports organization, CJJ Motorsports, has become a sponsor of the Irish Formula Females race team. John Campion, principal of CJJ Motorsports, is an Irish-American businessman and a renowned automotive enthusiast and noted collector.

Daly and Dempsey were raised on the tracks and in the circuits of the world's greatest auto racing teams, leading to a lifelong passion for motorsports.

Described as the yard stick for Irish drivers, Nicci's father Vivion Daly was one of the most successful drivers Ireland had ever seen during his 20-year racing career. Vivion passed away from lung cancer 16 years ago. To honor his legacy, Formula Females will use CJJ Motorsports' sponsorship support in part to subsidize the Formula Female Race Against Cancer, in aid of the Irish Cancer Society's cancer research department. The event will take place during the Mondello Historic Racing Festival, at Mondello Park in County Kildare, Ireland, on August 18 and 19.

"Ireland has a rich history in motorsports and it is crucial that we maintain its storied legacy. Nicci and Emma are passionate members of this community, and we feel it's our duty to ensure that they are given every opportunity to carry the torch," noted John Campion. "These women don't just represent the future of Irish racing; they are the future of auto racing on a global stage. The fact that they're using this event to raise money in Vivion's honor for the Irish Cancer Society makes it that much more special."

Daly is a data engineer for U.S.-based Juncos Racing, and Dempsey is a mechanic for U.K.-based Cliff Dempsey Racing, her father's race team.
